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1 MR. BERLIN: Could we do Monday morning
2 instead?

3 THE COURT: Certainly. You can do Monday --
4 have all of Monday morning, and then if 1:30 goes
5 away, then we'll do the afternoon.

6 MR. BERLIN: It would actually be
7 substantially better for the counsel who are
8 traveling if the thing goes away in the afternoon
9 for us to have the afternoon, but if not, we can
10 do the morning.

11 THE COURT: Well, let's go ahead and schedule
12 it and notice it for -- you can come in the night
13 before, Sunday night.

14 MR. BERLIN: We'll either come in Sunday
15 night or potentially Monday morning if it's the
16 afternoon.

17 THE COURT: Okay. I'm going to say let's
18 start at 9:30 on 11/25. I'm going to say half
19 day, but need full day if -- we'll do the motions
20 to dismiss -- those motions to dismiss on that
21 day. What else?

22 MR. HARDER: We have a motion to compel.

23 MR. BERLIN: We have a motion to dismiss --
24 we actually have several motions to dismiss,
25 Your Honor, that have been filed at various times.

1 Some of them are involving the substance of the
2 case, and we actually thought it might promote
3 judicial economy to bring those on for a hearing
4 after the appeal is heard that's pending in the
5 DCA on the temporary injunction and decided. One
6 of those is a jurisdictional motion about the
7 parent of Gawker Media. That can actually be
8 heard even before the DCA rules.

9 THE COURT: Okay.

10 MR. BERLIN: And I can attach -- if it's
11 limited to that, I actually think we'll only need
12 a couple of hours, not a whole day.

13 THE COURT: Okay. I was sort of thinking --
14 listening to the argument today, I was thinking
15 maybe not, but a motion to bifurcate the
16 injunction versus the damages, I wasn't sure if
17 that would be -- before today, I was thinking that
18 would be helpful. After today and hearing more
19 about some of the different damages, I thought
20 maybe it wouldn't be, but I throw it out there in
21 case you all think it would be.

22 MR. BERLIN: Well, we have also -- at
23 Your Honor's suggestion, if the damages are
24 limited, we might try to bring on the motion in
25 limine that Your Honor alluded to just so that we
