3 MR. BERLIN: Well, hopefully the
4 provision of an e-mail was designed to get me
5 out of being a witness and let the FBI and the
6 U.S. Attorney's Office speak for themselves.

7 THE COURT: So no one else has anything
8 else additional to add to that?

9 MR. HARDER: I did have one thing, Your
10 Honor. As to the phone records, one proposal
11 that I've made to -- during the hearing with
12 Judge Case was that if Gawker felt that the
13 phone calls or the records of phone calls
14 between Hulk Hogan and Bubba Clem and Heather
15 Clem and records of texts between them was
16 what they were after, I offered to produce
17 those and not produce all of the records of
18 Mr. Bollea's telephone calls and texts with
19 people who have nothing to do with the case.
20 That never became agreed upon, so we ended up
21 in the situation that we're in.

22 But that's a way of giving them what
23 they've asked for without invading Mr. Bollea's
24 privacy as to -- and also the privacy of other
25 people who have privacy rights in the phone

1 calls that they made and received. Thank you.

2 MR. BERLIN: Your Honor, may I just
3 speak to that?

4 THE COURT: You don't need to. Thank
5 you. So I'm going to -- in the packet of all
6 of the information was a proposed order by the
7 defense accepting Judge Case's report and
8 recommendations. And at this time I've
9 reviewed through all the expectations and I
10 reviewed the responses. I'm going to sign the
11 proposed order by Mr. Berlin.

12 MR. HARDER: Your Honor, just one

5 THE COURT: Here's what I would do,
6 whether you say --

7 MR. BERLIN: Your Honor, with respect,
8 this is something where Judge Case was correct
9 to begin with and concluded that records
10 relating to the FBI's investigation of the
11 dissemination of the tape at issue are
12 relevant enough that they should be produced.
13 And if they're not privileged, they need to be
14 produced.

15 There are a lot of things that I would
16 love for Your Honor to take your valuable time
17 reviewing because I think they're not relevant
18 and you should be able to say so. And I won't
19 ask for that, and this I think is one of those
20 where it should just be produced.

21 THE COURT: I think as it pertains to
22 the FBI -- and I appreciate somebody's
23 response it had about, well, if the FBI wanted
24 to raise an objection themselves, they could.
