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- Q. Tell me a little bit about the show, how would you describe Bubba's show at that time?
  - A. On satellite?
  - Q. Yeah.

- A. Insane, frat house, just fun. We were on this channel with Howard Stern, and, you know, we always -- I tell everyone now that the shows we did in 2007 and 2008 were better than Howard's. We always -- we put on a good show. We had a fun show. It was insanity.
  - Q. In what way?
    - A. A good way, organized chaos.
  - Q. Who did you-all try to appeal to?
- A. Men. A big thing with satellite was truckers, because they would drive across the country and didn't have to worry about signals dropping. So a lot of listeners were truckers on the road and that -- I don't want to stereotype -- but that mentality. And that's where we came from. We were definitely a dirty, juvenile show.
- Q. During that 2006-to-2010 period, was Bubba's show controversial?
  - A. Oh, yeah. That's why it worked.
- Q. In what way?
- A. Which way? Every way. I don't think there

1 was a way we weren't. 2 Give me an example. 3 Well, with satellite? Well, it's the type of 4 the things we put on the air, the phone callers we 5 would put on. I remember we put on a phone caller that 6 said that he had an intercourse with cows, so we had a 7 whole half-hour conversation with the guy about 8 intercourse with a cow. Those are things you don't 9 hear every day, and not many people could have a 10 conversation like Bubba could about that. 11 Q. Right. But he also do some serious stuff 12 too? 13 Α. Absolutely. 14 0. Some commentary? 15 Α. Yes, absolutely. We covered news. We put a 16 spin on it, but we would cover big news stories, and we 17 were topical, but we were also juvenile and dirty. 18 So I guess you-all talked about sex on the 19 show? 20 Α. Oh, yeah. 21 Was that a big topic for Bubba? 22 Α. You're asking me if it's a certain proportion 23 of the show? 24 Well, was it something that he regularly 0. talked about?

1 Α. Oh, yes, absolutely. We'd have people call 2 in and have sex on the air. 3 So I take it some of these things were fairly 4 graphic? 5 Α. We were on satellite for a reason. 6 Q. Do any examples stand out in your mind? 7 Α. No. 8 Q. You-all had strippers for guests? 9 Α. Several times. 10 Porn stars? Q. 11 Α. Several times. 12 Prostitutes? 0. 13 Α. I don't know. I'm sure some were, but no, I 14 don't think anyone ever said, I'm a hooker. No, we 15 probably -- we talked to -- what was the big one in New 16 York? Eliot Spitzer when that thing all came out, I 17 remember we had some escorts on the air discussing the 18 business, so, yeah, we purposely talk to hookers as 19 well. 20 Would Bubba and the other on-air talent talk Ο. 21 about their own sex lives? 22 Α. Yes. 23 Q. Bubba in particular? 24 I can remember him talking about his sex Α. life, usually making fun of himself, but he did bring

it up and talk about it.

- Q. Why did the show focus on sex like this?
- A. It's to our audience. That's what those -- that's what guys wanted to hear.
- Q. Was it something that the show became known for?
- A. I don't think we would be known as just a sex show about sex, no. I think we were a show about controversy and being funny.
- Q. But that was one the things within the constellation of stuff that you-all did that was controversial and funny?
- A. Yes.
- Q. So during this whole period of time Sirius was broadcasting -- sorry. Between the time that you came back in 2006 to the time you left in December 2010, Sirius was broadcasting that whole time?
  - A. Yes.
  - O. Was it also on Cox at that time?
- A. Which started on Cox on January 8th of 2008, and that's when they were doing two shows. We did two shows, mornings on Cox, afternoon on Sirius. I think for two years they did that, and then the last year Sirius just replayed our shows from the morning, except for Fridays where we gave them a live show one day per

- Q. What kind of content?
- 2 Α. Well, we had porn stars as quests, so 3 whatever they were talking about. We did quite a few 4 graphic things that was filmed. We had one of our guys 5 have a sex act with a rubber vagina. That was filmed for Bubba Raw. We did shockings with shock collars, 7 dog shock collars to certain parts of the anatomy on 8 We did some dating games sometimes for porn 9 stars that were filmed Bubba Raw. I don't know if they 10 ever had sex on those, but, yeah, it was part of it. 11 It was never porn. We never showed anything that was 12 pornographic --
- Q. Right.
- A. -- but definitely alluding to sex.
  - Q. But there was nudity on there at times?
- 16 A. Yes.
- Q. Switching gears slightly, when you worked at the show, was it produced at his studio on Lemon
- 19 Street?

- 20 A. Yes.
- Q. Tell me a bit about the layout of the studio.
- A. The on-air studio or the whole office?
- Q. The whole office. It was like a separate little building?
- A. Yeah. We had little -- it was the bottom

floor. It was a two-story building, and it was about 2,500 square feet. And when you would walk in, and there was a hallway that was kind of angled. And right here was Bubba's office, and right there was the studio that kind of went along the front of the building. And then there were two more offices for the producers, Matt Loyd and Brent Hatley.

And then there was a kitchen area, a bullpen area where the phone screeners sat and some interns sat. And there was an engineering room where all the equipment routed to.

And then there was the office that I shared with -- his name was Steve Miller. He did the videography for Bubba Raw. In between the engineering team and my office was a studio, a production studio, for Carl Harris. I forget. I left that out. Then the back was just a couple of work stations and a studio for Manson to create parody elements.

Q. Okay.

- A. And there was a green room too off the side where we would have guests sit and wait.
- Q. Through the various offices, were there cameras -- or, I'm sorry, let me ask a different question.

for security, but we would use them -- because our Bubba Raw wasn't nonstop constantly someone with a camera, sometimes you would miss things, so we would pull video from the security footage and put them in the bits that we would edit for on air.

One that comes to mind right now is one of our guys, his nickname was Pantera. His real name is Steve Petrick. He had a seizure, and it happened on camera, and we just, you know, we referred to that to show people, you know, Hey, he's having a seizure. So we did use it for things like that.

- Q. And from what I understand, sometimes they were used for gags in the green room with guests?
- A. Oh, yeah. We would always -- we secretly miked up the green room so they wouldn't know they were being listened to, and we would always do that. We would use that for bits.
- Q. Tell me a little bit about the setup of Bubba's office and the office that Brent Hatley and Matt Loyd shared?
  - A. They didn't share an office.
  - Q. Did Brent and Matt Loyd share?
  - A. No, they didn't share an office.
  - Q. They were in separate offices?
- A. They were right next to each other, in the

1 0. Okay. Earlier, you had mentioned that you 2 had been to Bubba's house? 3 Uh-huh (Indicates affirmatively). 4 Did you know when you worked for him whether Q. 5 there were cameras at his house? 6 Α. I knew that there were cameras at his house. 7 I don't know when I found that out. 8 0. I just -- I don't know if this fake or not. 21 And he looked at it and just kind of brushed 22 it off. 23 And I was like, That's weird. 24 That's the one thing that -- maybe it's 25 from everything being at least -- I remembered that,

- Q. For the time period after you left the radio show but before the images from the sex tape came out on the Internet, did you hear anything about Heather sleeping with men other than Bubba?
- A. I believe before the screen caps came out, I started hearing that there was a sex tape that she was in. And then when he they came out, I was like, Okay, it's true.
- Q. When you talk about screen caps, you mean the still images from the sex tape involving her and Hulk Hogan?
- A. Yes.
  - Q. When did you hear those rumors?
  - A. I don't remember exactly when. I would guess within a couple months of them coming out, because I heard it for awhile. It was just gossip, like, There is a sex tape out there with them. And, again, radio people are gossipers, so you get on the phone and you're like, Hey, do you know anything about this? Have you heard anything about that? Have you seen them?

And then I was always saying there is no way that's possible. And then when they came out, that's

when I was like, Oh, it's possible.

- Q. Who did you hear the gossip from?
- A. I don't remember. I think a lot of it was on the message boards and things like that. There were a lot of boards dedicated to the show. I think it was on there.
- Q. Did you ever have a discussion with anybody the possibility of a sex tape being out there prior to anything being published on the Internet?
- A. Discussing rumors about it, I'm sure I did.
- Q. With who?

A. I think Matt Calta was one. I think just some people I used to work with in radio. One girl name Lana, that I would go see. She had dogs, so we'd go to the dog park. We talked about it, because, again, it spread through radio pretty quick.

And people who still worked local, they would ask me whenever they would see me, Do you know anything about it.

And I was like, No, just what you hear.

- Q. So it sounds like you had multiple conversations with people around this time about rumors of there being a sex tape?
  - A. I probably had two to four.
- Q. In addition to Calta or Lana?

A. No, they're included.

- Q. Did you have any e-mails or texts with people about those rumors?
- A. I had an instant message sent to me with a timeline of the tapes.

And when that happened, I sent it to Mike saying, I guess it's real, or said something like, Hey, it's true, or, This is what's out there. I don't remember I said to him. But I know I had the timeline instant-messaged to me.

- Q. Who you did you get the instant message from?
- A. I don't know. It was one of the weird radio board names. It was something -- our show had a lot of strange sayings, like McGillicutty and weird things. So a lot of the fans, the Bubba Army would take those names as handles and post. And I would get things like the hate, saying, I can't believe you're off the show, just unanimous people. We'd call them keyboard tough guys. And it was something like that, but I don't remember the name or handle.
  - Q. So it was not somebody that you knew?
  - A. Not by the name, no.
  - Q. Did you communicate back with him?
- A. I don't remember, because I think it was sent to me when I wasn't at my machine. And when I came

recall the message boards having discussions about a sex tape involving Hulk Hogan and Heather?

- A. I believe that's what I saw. I don't remember exactly where the rumor started, because it wasn't just people that were in the satellite world. Like I said, it was rumors in the terrestrial world too. It got around in radio to people kind of fast.
- Q. Prior to receiving the instant message, how long had it been that you had been hearing the rumors?
  - A. I would say no more than a couple of months.
- Q. While you were working at the show, were you aware of any video recordings of Heather engaging in sexual activity with men other than Bubba?
  - A. No.
