Thereupon,

DETECTIVE CHRISTOPHER V. DOLCH

was called as a witness by the DEFENDANT and having first been duly sworn by the court reporter was examined and testified on his oath as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MS. MILLER:

Q. If you could please tell us your first and last name and spell your last name.

A. Chris Dolch, D-O-L-C-H.

Q. Where are you employed?

A. St. Petersburg Police Department.

Q. In what capacity?

A. I'm currently assigned to the Special Victims Unit.

Q. As a detective?

A. Yes, ma'am.

Q. Were you employed likewise in September of 2018?

A. Yes.

Q. We are here on the State of Florida versus Charisse Stinson. Are you familiar with this investigation?

A. Yes.

Q. Did you write any kind of police report reference your involvement?

A. No.

1 Q. Do you need to look at anybody else's to help
2 refresh your recollection?

3 A. No, ma'am.

4 Q. Do you have Lieutenant Nagle's?

5 A. That's what I have.

6 Q. Did you have an opportunity to review that?

7 A. Yes.

8 Q. As far as what she references you being involved
9 in, does that seem accurate as far as you remember?

10 A. Yes.

11 Q. Okay.

12 Tell me what you did.

13 A. Well, on September 4th we were told to put on old
14 clothes because we had to go search in what we were told
15 was a recycling center but I later found out it was
16 a straight-up dump. So that was our job for the day.

17 Q. Were you tasked with doing anything in this
18 investigation prior to that Tuesday, September 4th?

19 A. No, ma'am.

20 Q. You personally, I mean.

21 A. Correct.

22 Q. So do you go to the dump in old clothes?

23 A. Sure did.

24 Q. With the other St. Pete officers?

25 A. Yes.

1 Q. And what did you do once you got there?

2 A. We were handed rakes and were told to -- We were
3 looking for a red shoe or a small body. We had to rake
4 through trash which I recall was from a nursing home, an
5 adult nursing home.

6 Q. Did you find anything?

7 A. We did not find a red shoe or a body.

8 Q. Or anything that appeared to be of evidentiary
9 relevance?

10 A. Nothing evidentiary.

11 Q. Then what did you do?

12 A. At the end of the day?

13 Q. No, after the recycling center.

14 A. After the recycling recenter we were told to go to
15 the Imperial Palms and do a neighborhood canvas. It was an
16 apartment complex.

17 Q. Is this when you were speaking with the tenants of
18 the apartment complex or just looking through the apartment
19 complex?

20 A. We knocked on doors and asked if anybody saw
21 anything.

22 Q. Did anybody see anything?

23 A. No, ma'am.

24 Q. Do you know if anybody kept a log of who you
25 actually spoke with?

1 A. Yes, somebody did. I believe it was Tiffany
2 Crosby, but I could be wrong. She was assigned to my group.

3 Q. But as far as you know, she wrote down like the
4 names of the people you actually spoke with?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. What did you do after that?

7 A. At the end of the day, went home. We reconvened,
8 debriefed, and planned on coming back the next day but it
9 never happened. We never went back.

10 Q. At some point are you aware that they found the
11 child's body on that day?

12 A. Yes. That's why we didn't go back.

13 Q. Any other involvement with this investigation?

14 A. No.

15 Q. Ever met Charisse Stinson?

16 A. I have not.

17 Q. Ever met the father the child, Jordan Belliveau,
18 Senior?

19 A. Nope.
