3 LIEUTENANT TERRI E. NAGLE

4 was called as a witness by the DEFENDANT and having first
5 been duly sworn by the court reporter was examined and
6 testified on her oath as follows:

D I R E C T E X A M I N A T I O N

8 BY MS. MILLER:

9 Q. If you could please introduce yourself and spell
10 your last name.

11 A. Terri Nagle, N-A-G-L-E.

12 Q. Where are you employed?

13 A. St. Petersburg Police Department.

14 Q. In what capacity?

15 A. I am currently the lieutenant of the traffic
16 section.

17 Q. We're here today on the State of Florida versus
18 Charisse Stinson. Are you familiar with this case?

19 A. I am.

20 Q. You wrote one supplemental police report reference
21 your involvement in this investigation?

22 A. Correct.

23 Q. Have you had opportunity to review it prior to your
24 testimony here today?

25 A. Yes, ma'am.

1 Q. Is everything correct?

2 A. Yes, ma'am.

3 Q. Anything you would like to add or change?

4 A. No, ma'am.

5 Q. If you could just walk me through what your
6 involvement was, please.

7 A. On this date I was the sergeant in the
8 Special Victims Unit. We are members of the Tampa Bay
9 Regional Cart Team which is activated anytime an AMBER alert
10 or child abduction occurs.

11 On September 2nd of 2018 I received a phone call
12 that they were activating the Tampa Bay Regional Cart Team.
13 At that time, I called the members of my unit who were
14 available and who also worked in the Special Victims Unit,
15 both the childrens' side and the adults' side, and we were
16 advised to meet at Largo Police Department.

17 Q. This is kind of just like an "all hands on deck"
18 situation?

19 A. Yes.

20 Q. Were there any officers from St. Pete outside the
21 Special Victims Unit?

22 A. Everyone that I contacted were members of my unit.

23 Q. Do you know if other St. Pete units were tasked?

24 A. Unless maybe a canine, no there was no one else
25 tasked.

1 Q. Okay.

2 So then you respond to Largo Police Department?

3 A. We responded to Largo Police Department.

4 Once I ensured that all my people were in attendance, we
5 went in as a group and we met with FDLE and they gave
6 us a brief rundown of the investigation, showed us a picture
7 of the child that we were looking for and said that he lived
8 a short distance away with his mother, Ms. Stinson.

9 Q. Did they ask you to do anything specifically?

10 A. At this point we were tasked with going --
11 And I'm going to have to refer to my reports because I'm not
12 familiar with the addresses.

13 Q. That's fine.

14 A. The agent that we met with was Special Agent White.
15 He tasked us -- We were deployed to the Enclave apartment
16 complex where Ms. Stinson resided and we were told to,
17 basically, do a neighborhood canvas of Buildings 12 through
18 15 within the apartment complex.

19 Q. Are you looking for Jordan, or are you speaking to
20 the tenants of those buildings?

21 A. We spoke to tenants of all the apartments within
22 those specific buildings and, in addition, looking for
23 anything that may look out of place or suspicious in any
24 way.

25 Q. When you say "we", who is the "we"?

1 A. The "we" on this particular date was myself,
2 Detective Tiffany Crosby, Detective John Herrera, Detective
3 Sam Hyatt, Detective Christina Kenney, Detective Mariusz
4 Linowski, and myself.

5 Q. Did you find anything of evidentiary value on that
6 Sunday, September 2nd?

7 A. No, we did not.

8 Q. Did you make note of any of the tenants that you
9 spoke to?

10 A. We filled out -- FDLE gave us specific, I believe
11 they were four-part documents. Each resident that we went
12 to, we filled out one of the document and then we gave it to
13 Special Agent White.

14 Q. Did it have the names of the people you spoke to or
15 just the building unit?

16 A. Everything.

17 Q. Okay.

18 A. We did one document for, I believe they were
19 four-page documents, for each individual apartment.

20 Q. That's a lot of documentation.

21 A. Yes. It's their forms that they require; and they
22 were given back to them.

23 Q. Was everybody doing those forms, to your knowledge?

24 A. As far as I know, yes.

25 Q. Is there anyone that you spoke to that had

1 information about the case?

2 A. No one that we spoke to. And when I say "we",
3 I'm specifically referring to myself and my detectives.
4 Nobody provided us any information.

5 Q. And that was all at the Enclave?

6 A. Correct.

7 Q. Did you do anything else on September 2nd?

8 A. Yes. From there we were deployed. They broke us
9 up into groups again. I stayed with my group, and the
10 St. Pete officers all stayed together.

11 We were instructed to search each and every
12 dumpster, trash can, and property on the north side of
13 East Bay Drive from the Enclave west to Keene Road.

14 Q. And I think you make note in your report of
15 all the businesses and places that you --

16 A. Yes. I noted each individual business and the
17 location where we searched.

18 Q. Where you found dumpsters?

19 A. Correct.

20 Q. Did you find anything that appeared to be of
21 evidentiary relevance?

22 A. No, ma'am.

23 Q. How long did this case?

24 A. We were there all day. I don't remember
25 specifically. I know it was still light out when we

1 finished these particular tasks.

2 Q. Anything else on the 2nd?

3 A. Once we completed that, we were then asked to
4 respond to Lakeside Medical Center on East Bay Drive and
5 there we were met by FDLE agents and they advised that they
6 had found a backpack, I believe, that had child's clothing,
7 if I remember correctly, inside of it.

8 Q. What did they want St. Pete to do with it?

9 A. They didn't. It was kind of like a rally point.
10 They wanted us back there so that they could deploy us to
11 the next location that they wanted us to go.

12 Q. So you weren't there for the backpack --

13 A. No.

14 Q. -- other than a meeting place?

15 A. No. It was, basically, a meeting place.

16 Special Agent White was the one that I was specifically in
17 contact with; so once we'd finish one task, we'd go back and
18 then he'd deploy us wherever else we were needed, if we were
19 needed. That happened to be where he was when we talked to
20 him.

21 Q. Do you know if the backpack was collected?

22 A. I do not know.

23 Q. So you all meet at the backpack?

24 A. Correct.

25 Q. Then what happens?

1 A. From there, they deployed us to the Magnolia Square
2 Condominium complex at 501 East Bay Drive where we again
3 searched the entire exterior of the premises outside and
4 each dumpster on the property again looking for a child or
5 anything that would be suspicious in nature.

6 Q. Did you speak with any of the tenants at the
7 Magnolia Square apartment complex?

8 A. No. We did not do a door-to-door canvass there.
9 It was more just the property and the dumpsters.

10 Q. Did you find anything there?

11 A. No, ma'am.

12 Q. Then what did you do?

13 A. From there, we were deployed to the city of
14 Largo Recycling Center at 1551 Starkey Road--I believe it
15 was the city of Largo--and there they had brought three
16 industrial-sized dumpsters from The Palms which I think is
17 a nursing home or an ALF facility and they were tasked with
18 sifting through the contents of these dumpsters. Again, my
19 particular team did not find anything of value. And on this
20 particular date we were released at about 2130 hours.

21 Q. That's the end of that Sunday?

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. Are you involved again on Monday the 3rd?

24 A. Not on the 3rd but on Tuesday, the 4th.

25 Q. Is there a reason why nothing happened on Monday?

1 A. Not to my knowledge.

2 Q. So then the next involvement is September 4th?

3 A. Correct.

4 We have to wait. We don't reach out to them.
5 They contact us if they need our assistance.

6 Q. Okay. What happens on the 4th?

7 A. On Tuesday, the 4th at 11:08 a.m. I was again
8 contacted that they were again activating the CART team and
9 they asked for our assistance. I rallied up my detectives.
10 This was a workday for us, whereas the previous date that we
11 were activated was not.

12 So I grabbed every detective that was in the
13 office--this was a slightly different group of
14 detectives--to assist with the Largo case. We were again
15 requested to meet at the Largo police department.

16 Q. You were in charge of the Special Victim Unit at
17 that time?

18 A. Yes, yes.

19 Q. What happens once you get to the Largo police
20 department?

21 A. So I grab my group of detectives:
22 Detective Crosby again, Detective Chris Dolch,
23 Detective Herrera, Hyatt, Linowski, Detective Karen Lofton,
24 Detective Desmarais, Detective Kenney, and I and we went to
25 Largo police department again. Once we were signed-in, we

1 were deployed back to the recycling center. There were
2 numerous groups of officers from different agencies, and we
3 spent several hours just sifting through dumpsters.
4 They would bring them, empty them, and then we would sift
5 through them.

6 Q. Were there any civilians looking with you all?

7 A. I don't recall. Like I said, I stuck with my
8 group, and we specifically dealt with what we had to do.

9 Q. Find anything if at the recycling center?

10 A. My group did not, no.

11 Q. Then what did you do?

12 A. Once we were done there, we were asked to go to
13 Imperial Palms apartment complex where I met with
14 Sergeant Barton from the Largo police department and at that
15 time, he asked us to search the property of Imperial Palms.
16 Again we checked dumpsters, trash cans, looked for anything
17 unusual. We did not go door-to-door, though, doing a
18 neighborhood canvas.

19 Q. Find anything there?

20 A. No, ma'am.

21 Q. Then what did you do?

22 A. And then at about 1740 hours on that date,
23 I received a phone call advising that the child had been
24 located and we were requested to meet at the recreation
25 center. I believe it would have been the east side of the

1 center where we met.

2 Q. What was that for?

3 A. There they just, basically, told us that they had
4 located the child and that the child was deceased. We were
5 kind of in a holding pattern to see if they needed any
6 further assistance.

7 And then we completed our neighborhood canvas of
8 Imperial Palms where we did again speak to, went
9 door-to-door speaking to residents.

10 Q. So they sent you back to Imperial Palms --

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. -- and said, "Now go ask and see if anybody knows
13 anything"?

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. My understanding is there were a bunch of law
16 enforcement officers that were going to the Imperial Palms
17 on that day.

18 A. Yes. I know there was, definitely. I don't know
19 which agency it was. I want I to say it was Florida Highway
20 Patrol but I'm not positive. But I know there were other
21 agencies aside from just St. Petersburg.

22 Q. Are you doing the same four-page form for every
23 tenant that you speak with?

24 A. I can't remember if we did the four-page documents
25 for that neighborhood canvass or not. The first one, I

1 absolutely know we did because I've only seen them in
2 training. My guys were like beside themselves that these
3 forms had to be filled out even if we didn't speak to anyone
4 so... But I honestly don't recall; we did several buildings
5 out there.

6 Q. Is there a log somewhere of what buildings you
7 went to?

8 A. Yes. I have the buildings in my report. And
9 everything that we did as my particular team was reported
10 back to Sergeant Barton of Largo police department or FDLE.

11 Q. But this one we don't know if the actual tenants
12 were documented anywhere?

13 A. Not in my report, they weren't.

14 Q. And did anybody have any kind of useful
15 information?

16 A. No, we didn't have any useful information that
17 would have assisted with the investigation.

18 Q. Then what did you do?

19 A. Again, we were holding pattern at approximately
20 2030 hours and then they advised that they no longer needed
21 our assistance and we were released.

22 Q. Any other involvement with this investigation?

23 A. No, ma'am. I completed my report and that's
24 about it.

25 Q. Have you ever met Charisse Stinson?

1 A. I don't believe I even met her on that date, no.

2 Q. How about the father of the deceased child,
3 Jordan Belliveau, Senior?

4 A. I know he does live in our city but whether or not
5 I have met him, I don't know.

6 Q. Nothing stands out?

7 A. No.

8 Q. And you didn't come across him or his family during
9 the course of this investigation?

10 A. No, ma'am.

11 MS. MILLER: Nothing further.

12 MR. BOLAN: No questions.
