10	with the St. Petersburg Police Department.
11	Q How long have you been with St. Pete PD?
12	A February will be four years.
13	Q Any prior law enforcement experience?
14	A Yes.
15	Q Where was that?
16	A I worked at a sheriff's office in North Carolina
17	for three-and-a-half years.
18	Q What county?
19	A Lee County Sheriff's Office.

23	A The Downtown Deployment Team.

Okay. What unit were you assigned to back in 1 Q 2 February of '21? So I was still on midnights in District 2, so my 3 Α 4 schedule was 10 p.m. to 8 a.m. on patrol. And that night were you riding as a one-man 5 Q 6 unit? 7 Yes. Α 8 Were you in a marked cruiser? 0 9 Yes. Α Tell me how you became involved in the case. 10 Q I remember the call coming out over the radio. 11 Α 12 Due to the circumstances of the initial complainant stating that he believed his friend was dead, Dispatch 13 14 sent several units to the apartment complex. I arrived shortly on scene with two other officers prior to making 15 16 entry into the apartment. And who were the officers that you were with 17 18 when you guys entered? 19 Officer Hollister and Officer Godsall. Α 20 The initial complainant, do you know if that was 0 21 Rodney Green or if that was Deronrick Green, if you know? 22 I don't recall. I didn't know the complainant's Α 23 name. But the complainant information you had 24 0 was that complainant called and said friend was dead? 25

2	Q	Did the complainant, if you recall, indicate
3	that they	were injured themselves?
4	А	Not that I recall, no.
5	Q	Okay. When you guys are there any lay
6	witnesses	outside when you first approach?
7	А	No.
8	Q	Have you I'm sorry, I should have asked you
9	this. In	Lee County well, I guess, have you ever
10	worked Maj	or Crimes/Homicide in St. Pete?
11	А	Not in St. Pete. I was a detective sergeant in
12	North Card	olina prior to leaving and moving back home here.
13	Q	And was that like with the major crimes or
14	homicide?	
15	А	We did every case and forensics out in the
16	field. It	was a small department. We didn't have a lot
17	going on.	They're like you get to do everything. Okay,
18	thank you.	
19	Q	How long were you in that role?
20	А	About four months before I decided it was time
21	to come ho	ome, I've got to come home.
22	Q	And when you there's some discussion when you
23	had entere	ed, and you were trying to figure out how
24	somebody's	injuries occurred. You were trying to figure

out if they were shot. Was that the person on the ground

or the person that was moving about that was injured?

A It was going to probably be both individuals because I know the individual who was on the floor upon entry, I wasn't going to just assume how he was injured, but I mean, you could tell that he was injured and probably no longer alive. And then the other individual, I remember him profusely bleeding from his mouth as he was trying to speak, so I assumed he was injured as well.

Q And was he -- the individual who was still moving around, Rodney, was he able to provide any information about what had happened?

A He said he did not recall. From what I remember him saying, he was sleeping. He woke up, and he found his friend. And that was from the initial. Now, I don't know if somebody else got something different once they got him calmed down. He was very, very distraught once we arrived.

Q Am I correct that he didn't even realize he was shot also for some period of interaction with you all?

A Yes, ma'am.

Q At one point you, like, check one of the bedroom windows, and you indicate I didn't see anything on the window. What was it you were looking for at that time?

A I don't recall anything about the window, but I do know once we initially arrived and went in, the

complainant was in the living room. At some point, the other officers directed him outside and had someone stand by. I remember going — the kitchen was on the right. It was a very short hallway. There was a bedroom off to the end of the hallway, and I know I remember clearing the scene just to make sure there was nobody else. I remember asking him if there were any weapons in the house. I did notice in the bedroom where he stated he was sleeping, there was some blood in the bed, and there was kind of a blood trail I guess of him coming out of the bedroom and that was —

Q So was it based on him saying that he was, like, hit or something in the bedroom? Were you trying to verify that or see if you could find any evidence or corroboration of that?

A Yeah. Just due to his injury and the initial scene of the blood trail coming out and him stating that he was asleep in that bedroom but he didn't recall what had happened, yeah.

Q And am I correct that you noticed that the blood was coagulating already?

A Yes. On the individual who was right by the door, upon entry, there was a pretty decent circular pattern of blood around his head, and it appeared that the blood closest to his head had already started kind of

coagulating. You could see that from just kind of standing next to him on entry.

Q Did that give you any information as far as like trying to estimate the time that everything had occurred?

A So that's — then initially, once we had the complainant and we kind of just asked him very brief questions — because like I said, he was a bit of a mess at the time, which I don't blame him. But once he couldn't really give us any information, I wasn't able to build any kind of timeline to know how long his friend had been there versus how long he had been sleeping before he realized he was injured. So I wasn't able to get an initial timeframe.

Q Okay. There -- do you remember anything about the temperature in the apartment, whether it seemed extra cold, extra warm, normal room temperature?

A I know outside, just due to the fact it was
February and I remember that night, it was very, very
cold. I remember once the scene had been secured, I
started the crime scene log, and I actually remember
asking my sergeant if I could pull my vehicle back around
to face the apartment — there were two poles, and I swear
my Taurus just barely fit — because it was so cold
outside. But as far as the temperature inside, I don't
recall, but I know it was very cold outside.

Okay. Do you remember if there was a ceiling 1 Q 2 fan at all in the living room? 3 Not that I recall. Α 4 Okay. Where -- so I think maybe -- where you 0 pulled your car up with the two poles, is that where you 5 stayed put with the log? Was that the entrance to the 6 7 crime scene? 8 So initially I started the crime scene 9 log, and then I would get out of my vehicle and mark more things down and get back in. I positioned my vehicle 10 facing the apartment door just so that I could make sure 11 that it would stay secure while I was trying to not freeze 12 out in the weather. So I would kind of go in my car and 13 outside of my car. 14 15 Q where was the entrance to the scene? 16 I don't recall where they ended up putting the 17 entrance, but I just remember being inside of the crime 18 scene facing the door just to make sure it was secured 19 because I know we waited a while for detectives to come 20 out. Do you remember which side of the building you 21 Q would have been on? 22 So I know -- I want to say it would be like the 23 back side. So if you come in Emerald Pointe and you're 24 kind of driving through and you see all the main parts 25

1 from the parking area, it would have been on the opposite 2 side of the building where it was a grassy area that butted up to the fence line for the apartment complex. 3 4 Okay. 0 5 So you basically would have to walk around the 6 building to get to that apartment. You wouldn't be able to see if it you just pulled up and parked. You would 7 8 have had to walk around the back side of the building. 9 Okay. After Mr. Green, Rodney Green was transported to the hospital, did you ever have any 10 subsequent contact with him? 11 12 I did not. The -- his brother, Deronrick that was on scene, 13 14 did you ever have any contact with him? 15 Α The individual that was in the doorway when we 16 made contact initially? The living guy that was uninjured. 17 18 I know that there was the individual initially 19 on the floor, and then I know the other victim that was injured. Those are the only two people that I recall that 20 I had any interaction with. I don't remember a third 21 22 person. Okay. And the -- you indicated the door 23 0 wouldn't open fully because Mr. Barnes' feet were kind of 24

in the way.

1 A Yes.

Q Do you know -- was the door open like as much as it could open? So like if I were to watch that video, that would be an accurate kind of where -- how far the door was able to open?

A Yeah. So from what I recall is that once we made approach to the apartment door, the apartment door was open slightly. Which once we kind of walked up and saw, that gave us the exigency to go in and make sure, Oh, my gosh, what's going on. Let's secure the scene.

So it was open just enough. It did open a slight bit more, but when we made entry initially, we were very cautious to make sure we didn't disturb the body that was on the ground because he was kind of right in the doorway. His head was this way towards the hallway. His feet were here. So when the door opened, we just tried to kind of go over him and around to not disturb him.

Q Gotcha. You then stayed at the scene I guess until you're relieved early morning?

A Yes.

Q Once you left, were you ever asked to do any additional follow-up or investigation?

A No.

Q When Mr. Whitfield was arrested I think February 16th, did you have any involvement in either that
