We learned that one individual was inside presumably deceased. Another individual was at the hospital, and he suffered a gunshot wound to his face. That was Rodney Green. Once we learned that information, a warrant was going to be obtained to process the apartment. Detective Mensah and I went back to the police station to interview two of the witnesses who responded to headquarters.

Q And about how long do you think you're on scene when you get out there before you head back to headquarters?

A I guess 20 minutes, give or take approximately.

Once we learned it was Darren Barnes, 23 then we found the next of kin for him, which was his mother, Leslie Carter, and then we responded to 1325 16th 24

Street South and informed her of her son's passing.

I make my way through the kitchen and into the living room, and just prior to going into the living room, that's where you see the first deceased individual. And then I turned into the living room. That's when I saw several other deceased individuals. But I continued to a bedroom.
