TAKTIKOS: And good morning, your Honor. 5 Theodora Taktikos --THE COURT: I ordered him. Do we need him 6 7 over? 8 MS. SEIFER-SMITH: I don't think so. 9 THE COURT: This is just under the guise of 10 procedural -- move things along, not talking about 11 substance, our little carved-out exception --12 MS. SEIFER-SMITH: So presumptive. 13 THE COURT: -- death penalty guy showing up 14 for every hearing, right? 15 MS. TAKTIKOS: Yes. 16 THE COURT: Madam Court Reporter's here. 17 Thank you, madam court reporter. showed up. 18 MS. SEIFER-SMITH: Yes. 19 THE COURT: Whitfield 21-01099; murder one, 20 attempted murder, robbery and 21-01513 is three 21 first degree murders and an attempted murder. 22 The reason for the court reporter is the 23 State, at this point, have suggested they're 24 seeking the death penalty, right?

MS. TAKTIKOS: Yes, your Honor.

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1513. 1 2 THE COURT: There's 3 also -- (inaudible) -- contraband, the 21 number on 4 the last page. 5 Procedurally, what's the status at this point? 6 Still working through depos? 7 MS. SEIFER-SMITH: Correct, yes. 8 THE COURT: Are you lead? 9 MS. SEIFER-SMITH: I'm not. It's Ms. Manuele 10 I'm standing in for this morning. But I know that 11 she's -- taken a number of depositions. Traditionally, there's a 23 two-person team, and one does guilt, and one does 24 penalty.

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true for court appointed or private attorneys. However, within our office, we do operate in a different way.

THE COURT: The team concept?

MS. SEIFER-SMITH: The team concept.

THE COURT: All for one, one for all; everybody gets involved in all aspects of it.

Well, I guess my question was going to be directed -- we have a dual aspect situation here preparing for guilt phase and then contemplating -- I mean, is there a chance that there's going to be kind of waiver?

MS. TAKTIKOS: We haven't had any offers.

MS. SEIFER-SMITH: I mean, it's entirely possible. The case in which the death penalty has been sought is all family of Mr. Whitfield. So the next of kin are also all family of Mr. Whitfield.

So we're hopeful that there may be a potential resolution. However, I don't believe we're at the point where we can make any kind of formal offer to the State yet. So --

THE COURT: No. I think you got to finish the depos. I guess what I'm worried about is that it's a '21 case. We're into early '24. And if nothing's being done on penalty even if we get done

with guilt phase --1 2 MS. SEIFER-SMITH: That's not true. 3 THE COURT: Well, that's why I'm inquiring. 4 MS. SEIFER-SMITH: Yeah. So we understand 5 that our obligation is to engage in a dual 6 investigation. Obviously, the legal defenses and 7 discovery as well as mitigation investigation. 8 And we're proceeding accordingly. 9 THE COURT: All right. So when should we get 10 together again? 11 MS. SEIFER-SMITH: My suggestion, given mine 12 and Ms. Manuele's schedules, would be in April. 13 THE COURT: All right. Is this the last round 14 of depositions you'll need for -- last significant 15 round of depositions? 16 MS. SEIFER-SMITH: I believe so. I mean, I 17 will be candid with your Honor. I didn't have an 18 opportunity to speak with Ms. Manuele specifically 19 about this pretrial before coming in this morning. 20 THE COURT: I know we were here 'til seven 21 something last night picking a jury. I understand. 22 I know she was otherwise indisposed, as was I. 2.3 MS. SEIFER-SMITH: So my suggestion would be 24 some time late in April, the week of the 22nd, if

that works for the State.

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THE COURT: April-ish. You got -- is this 1 2 really the last round -- significant round of depos 3 coming up? MS. TAKTIKOS: That's my understanding, yes. 4 5 We've had two other significant rounds. 6 hoping this will be the last. And so at the next 7 pretrial, we'll be setting one or more of these for 8 trial, so... 9 THE COURT: Well, all right. What day of the 10 week? Wednesdays are good? 11 MS. TAKTIKOS: Preferably not a Wednesday, 12 I'm free every other day except for your Honor. 13 Wednesday. 14 THE COURT: April 16th or April 18th, any of 15 those good? 16 MS. SEIFER-SMITH: I'm not certain about 17 Ms. Manuele's calendar, but I think at the moment, either one is fine for us. 18 19 The 1st, 16th or 18th? THE COURT: 20 MS. SEIFER-SMITH: How about the 18th? 21 That okay with you? THE COURT: 22 MS. TAKTIKOS: That's fine, your Honor. 23 4/18/24 for the next pretrial at THE COURT: 24 8:30 on all three numbers. 25 Speedy's been waived previously, right?
