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THE COURT: Well, I've got several matters, obviously. Let me find them on my calendar so I can read the numbers into the record -- 21-01099 and what's the other one?

MR. KOSKINAS: 21-01513.

THE COURT: Okay. We were going to try the 01-01099 first, right?

MR. KOSKINAS: Yes, sir.

THE COURT: We set it in March. I'm going to have to move it.

MS. SEIFRED-SMITH: So we might not be able to help you in calendaring because Ms. -- Ms. Manuele is out of town today.

THE COURT: Well, I just need to tell you guys so you understand, I got to move that date. I was making plans for next year, and I didn't realize when I made them that I already -- I mean, I don't like to set trials that far in advance for just that reason.

All right. Mr. Whitfield has joined us. He's here on his matter. Well, he's got several matters, obviously. Let me find it on my calendar so I can read the numbers into the record: 21-01099, and what's the other one?

MR. KOSKINAS: 21-01513. 1 2 THE COURT: Okay. And we were going to try 3 the 01099 first, right? 4 MR. KOSKINAS: The predicate, yes, sir. 5 THE COURT: And we set it in March. I'm going 6 to have to move it. We're going to have to have 7 Ms. Manuele here, I guess, to coordinate all the 8 calendars. 9 But this get together is -- the other one is 10 the one that the State is seeking the death penalty 11 on? 12 MR. KOSKINAS: Correct. 13 THE COURT: No movement or any change as far 14 as any discussions about that? 15 MR. KOSKINAS: No. 16 THE COURT: All right. No thoughts on -- I 17 mean, no offers to be made in that regard or --MS. SEIFER-SMITH: We have had some slowdowns 18 19 in our -- (inaudible) -- investigation that we 20 weren't anticipating. I don't know if your Honor 21 recalls we were hopeful that we would have a 22 presentation to the State by the middle of July. 23 That's obviously -- well, it's not obviously 24 to your Honor. But it's obvious to the State that,

that has not happened.

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So our hopes is that we will get something to 1 2 them within the next, maybe, eight weeks. 3 then, obviously, we can have further discussions 4 about that. 5 THE COURT: So besides me telling you about 6 the trial-date issue, what do we need to discuss or 7 talk about today? 8 MS. SEIFER-SMITH: Well, I suppose given the 9 trial-date issue, I don't know if your Honor would 10 like to see us sooner than what we would otherwise 11 propose because we would propose a pretrial in, you 12 know, like eight to 12 weeks. But since we're 13 having to reschedule the trial --14 THE COURT: Well, you guys are so booked. 15 schedule is not that bad. You guys are 16 the -- "cap" team, right? 17 Is there anybody other than you guys. You and 18 Jess --19 MS. SEIFRED-SMITH: Yes. 20 You three are it, right? THE COURT: 21 MS. SEIFER-SMITH: No, but --22 Who else is here? THE COURT: 23 MS. SEIFRED-SMITH: -- Ms. Manuele and I are 24 the only first-chair qualified in the office. 25 THE COURT: Right. So it's not -- the -- my

point is that anything that gets scheduled along 1 2 those lines is going to have to involve you guys --3 MS. SEIFRED-SMITH: Correct. 4 THE COURT: -- which means it's going to take 5 a long time. So the sooner we can do it, the less 6 delay it's going to be getting that first case 7 actually to trial. 8 MS. SEIFRED-SMITH: I would not disagree. 9 I mean, I think we should probably come back 10 sooner rather than later just for scheduling --11 MR. KOSKINAS: How about next week? 12 (SIMULTANEOUS TALKING) 13 I thought you were gone --THE COURT: 14 MR. KOSKINAS: Whatever; week, two weeks --15 MS. SEIFRED-SMITH: We're --16 MR. KOSKINAS: I am. But that's okay. 17 got my calendar. Ms. Stanzick (phonetic) here. 18 If we're just going to reset a trial date, 19 I'm not that far out anyways. I assume 20 that you're going to set it after March, so I'm 21 going to be fine. 22 THE COURT: Well, I have time before then, but 23 they didn't have time before then. So, I mean --24 MR. KOSKINAS: Ms. Barnes' mother is very

appreciative to setting it before that.

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THE COURT: I understand. I'll take you first at 8:30 on Wednesday. I mean, it's just picking another trial date. But I think -- then it's figuring out when the next pretrial is to see how discovery is going, right?

MR. KOSKINAS: Judge, as far as the trial date -- and maybe they can take that back to Ms. Manuele and speed things up on Tuesday when everybody shows up.

All right. So let's do it Tuesday --

THE COURT: Well, let me see what I can tell you. I don't have anything else in March of '25.

That week I'm going to be gone. I wouldn't want to do it the week of the 17th because I'm leaving on like that Thursday or Friday. I'm going to be gone that next week of our trial date set.

But the 3rd and the 10th I would be available in March, available throughout April, other than we got Easter as a holiday on the 18th.

I mean, you thinking four days, or we thinking longer for this, a full week?

MR. KOSKINAS: No. I think four days. I think four days is probably fine.

THE COURT: So -- I mean, I pretty much have

anything in April, the first two weeks in March.

Let's see. February I got --

MR. KOSKINAS: Well, if you're going to February, I got some trouble. But if you stay in March, I'm fine.

THE COURT: I got March 3rd or March 10th. I got -- then I would have the 7th, 14th, 21st or 28th in April. So any of those would work.

The only qualification being the week of the 14th. You got Easter on the 18th.

But if you think four days -- because this is the non -- non-DP case, right?

Okay. So any of those dates would work. So maybe prescreen him. We'll get together on Tuesday. Come up with another date, and then talk about when our interim next pretrial needs to be for discovery purposes.

MS. SEIFER-SMITH: Okay.

MR. KOSKINAS: Thank you, Judge.

THE COURT: All right. He's welcome to come over. I don't -- you know, I don't -- I'm not sure I want to drag him over twice in two weeks to talk about a trial date. But I -- I don't want to discourage him from coming over. He's welcome to be here at any and all hearings.

But all we're going to do is reschedule a date to another date, and then figure out when the next pretrial is. But if he wants to get out of the monotony of sitting over there and come over, that's fine. MS. SEIFER-SMITH: Mr. Whitfield has indicated he would like us to waive his presence for next Tuesday. THE COURT: Fine. I don't have a problem with that. All right. Sounds good. See you next Tuesday. (PROCEEDINGS CONCLUDED)
