5	the deponent herein, being first duly sworn, was
6	examined and testified as follows:
7	DIRECT EXAMINATION
8	BY MS. SEIFER-SMITH:
9	Q Can you please state your name for the
10	record?
11	A Dennis Porter.
12	Q We're here in the matters of Cornelius
13	Whitfield. We have a couple of case numbers.
14	21-01099 CF and 21-01513 CF. But your involvement I
15	think was just one police case number of 2021-6023.
16	Does that sound about right?
17	A Yes, ma'am.
18	Q My name is Julie Seifer-Smith, together with
19	Ms. Russell and Mr. McGreen, and we're assistant
20	public defenders who represent Mr. Whitfield. Also
21	present for the state, Tom Koskinas and Theo Danzig.
22	So you've been sworn in by our court
23	reporter. You just had an opportunity to review your
24	report. And I think you said you had already read
25	it

1	A Correct.
2	Q some time ago?
3	A Uh-huh.
4	Q Was there anything else that you reviewed in
5	connection with this case before being sworn in?
6	A No.
7	Q Anything that you need to review, anything
8	else?
9	A No.
10	Q Okay. Can you tell me just a little bit
11	about like your professional development and when you
12	started with the department, what your job was back in
13	2021, what your job is now?
14	A Sure. So I started with the police
15	department in '97. Went through the police academy.
16	I have experience in patrol, vice and narcotics,
17	S.W.A.T. team. I've been on the S.W.A.T. team for, on
18	and off since '98. I have been in canine for 12
19	years. And I've been in intel now since I believe
20	'26 16. Sorry.
21	Q So are you still with the department?
22	A Iam.
23	Q In intel?
24	A Intel Division.
25	Q Do you also have a dog?

1	A No longer.
2	Q Okay. I'm sorry about that. We love talking
3	to canine officers.
4	A Yeah.
5	Q Well maybe you have one at home, which is
6	fine.
7	A Yeah.
8	Q So in 2021 what was I understand that
9	S.W.A.T. is kind of like a part time.
10	A It is.
11	Q What was your primary role?
12	A Intel Division, in particular.
13	Q How did you get involved in this case?
14	A We were called as a S.W.A.T. call out.
15	Q Did you have any other involvement, like
16	prior involvement like in your role as intel in the
17	prior investigations into Mr. Whitfield?
18	A No.
19	Q Were you aware of like the prior homicide
20	investigation and surveillance being done by SIU with
21	respect to Mr. Whitfield?
22	A Yes.
23	Q And how were you aware of that?
24	A Just from in the office, inner office about,
25	communications about just what was going on.

1	Situational awareness.
2	Q Okay. But you hadn't done any kind of
3	research like in your capacity in intel for those
4	investigations?
5	A I don't believe so.
6	Q Okay. When there was this initial kind of
7	like S.W.A.T. call out, do you recall what the
8	information was given and what was requested?
9	A That there was a shooting, right. There was
10	an individual still inside the residence. Status of
11	the victims was unknown.
12	Q And was the location 2968 Emerson Avenue
13	familiar to you for any reason?
14	A No, not offhand.
15	Q What did you do once you a received the call
16	out?
17	A We responded to the area.
18	Q And did you have a particular responsibility
19	once you got there?
20	A Yeah. I was a team leader on the S.W.A.T.
21	team at that point, but I reported to the command post
22	and was assigned as one team of two for a rescue team.
23	And I was assigned to the south east portion of the
24	residence.
25	Q Who went to the south east portion of the

residence with you? 1 It was myself. And I believe it was operator 2 А 3 Cody Sendom (phonetic). And I believe there was a few 4 others. 5 And how did you get to that location, like 0 the south east --6 7 А On foot. Okay. What were your observations when you 8 Q 9 got to the home? 10 So we were in the back alley. There was a А vehicle out there in the back and we were -- we stood 11 12 behind that, behind a truck keeping eyes on the south 13 and east portion of what we could see. 14 Did you see any kind of movement at the 0 house? 15 16 No, not from my location. А 17 Were you able to see inside of the home from Q 18 your location? No, ma'am. 19 Α 20 Did you hear anything from the home? Ο 21 Just what was going on out front. I mean, Α 22 there would have been other operators that responded 23 to the front and they had the BearCat and things like 24 that, the Rook. 25 Q So when you're talking about hearing things

1	from the front, is it like you're hearing like noises
2	directly from the front as well as radio about what's
3	going on?
4	A On the speaker, on the loud speaker, things
5	like that as they're trying to communicate with inside
6	the residence.
7	Q What did you hear happening?
8	A Just St. Petersburg Police Department, you
9	know, come out. Normal just notifications of who we
10	are, we're there, we're outside, you know, trying to
11	engage anyone who may be inside the residence.
12	Q About how long did that occur, that kind of
13	communication?
14	A I don't know for sure.
15	Q Did it seem like minutes, hours?
16	A It normally takes, you know, it takes some
17	time normally. They give it out several times. They
18	make the announcements over and over.
19	Q Did it seem like it was like more than 10
20	minutes?
21	A I don't recall, ma'am.
22	Q Okay. And did you hear anything else happen,
23	either over the radio or like just listening to what
24	was occurring around you?
25	A Just loud noises. Because I know there's

some activity in the front. There was loud noises. 1 2 And then, you know, that was-- then you could hear 3 challenging. And I think at one point Mr. Whitfield came out. And then once out and in custody we were 4 directed -- there was two rescue and arrest teams were 5 6 directed to make entry into the residence. 7 When say challenging, what does that mean? 0 Just communicating. Please come out. Come 8 А 9 out the front. You know, show me your hands. Things 10 like that, just typical verbiage. 11 Q Did it sound like he did that? I know you're 12 not able to see from your advantage point. 13 I just heard that. I didn't know what was А 14 going on. I couldn't see. So at a certain point were you told to do 15 Ο 16 anything, like to move from where you were? 17 А Yeah, once Mr. Whitfield was in custody. 18 So you heard what, over the radio that he was Q 19 taken into custody? Yeah. They give communications, directions 20 А 21 over the radio. 22 Were you told what to do at that point? 0 23 Make entry into the house. Α 24 And so --Q And secure the residence. 25 А

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-- what did you do, where did you go? 1 Q There was the other people team that was to 2 Α 3 the west. We were south east. They were south west. We had medics. They had medics with them as well. 4 We made entry into the back. I believe it was the south 5 west corner there was a door. There's a bedroom, 6 7 right. That's where I went. We went through that way. Went through that into a kitchen, and then from 8 9 the kitchen into a living room. 10 What were your initial observations in the Q 11 home? 12 А No subjects in the bedroom. Nothing in the 13 kitchen. And then when we got into-- when I got into 14 the doorway between the kitchen and the living room, I 15 could see multiple individuals. I could see the 16 S.W.A.T. medics making contact with them as well. So it sounds like you all weren't the first 17 Q 18 people in the home, like your team? 19 А They were in front of us, yeah. 20 Okay. And did you have an opportunity to 0 21 observe like who the medics had contact with? 22 There were two elderly females and there was А 23 a male. 24 Did you approach them at all? Q 25 No. I mean, I was there but no, I did not А

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1 approach them. 2 What did you do then? Q 3 А So I watched -- they made contact with a younger child on the west side of the residence. 4 5 This was some other team or--Ο 6 А Other members. The ones that entered in 7 front of us, they removed that child from the residence. Got the child out of the residence. 8 And then we called for, you know, a deep clear, meaning 9 10 other areas of the residence. And there was some 11 garage area in the back and things like that. So we do a deep clear of the residence, meaning, now we're 12 13 looking for places that people can hide, extra places, 14 you know, cupboards, closets, small confined spaces, 15 under beds, attic. We want to make sure the residence 16 is clear of any other individuals. Did you find any more people? 17 Q 18 Α No, ma'am. 19 And I know the purpose of this kind of search 0 20 is not for anything of evidentiary value. 21 А No. 22 But did you see anything that you thought Ο 23 might be important for detectives or crime scene later? 24 25 А No.

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1	Q Do you recall now seeing any weapons,
2	anything like that?
3	A No, ma'am.
4	Q After that deep clear what did you do next?
5	A Exit the residence. Once it's secured it's
6	secure at that point, right, and then the S.W.A.T.
7	team members will, you know, pass that off to the
8	detectives or the officers there that are going to
9	secure that, right, secure the crime scene.
10	Q Did you do any further work at that scene?
11	A No.
12	Q Did you participate in a debrief?
13	A I did.
14	Q Do you recall the content of debrief?
15	A That's just basic operational, how we
16	responded, what our actions were, you know what I
17	mean, when we respond to things like that. It's just
18	an overview. Typically that's how it's conducted.
19	Q Okay.
20	A But nothing specific. No, ma'am.
21	Q Did you have any contact with the child?
22	A No.
23	Q And did you ever have any contact with Mr.
24	Whitfield?
25	A No.

1	Q	Did you even see him at all that day?
2		I don't believe so.
	A	
3	Q	And did you participate in any kind of
4	debriefs	, not necessarily S.W.A.T. related, but intel
5	related,	major crimes related with respect to the
6	investiga	ations?
7	A	No, nothing case related.
8	Q	I don't think I have any further questions.
9		MS. SEIFER-SMITH: Anybody else, Ms. Russell.
10	Okay.	
11		MR. KOSKINAS: That's it. Thank you, sir.
