7	DIRECT EXAMINATION
8	BY MS. SEIFER-SMITH:
9	Q Can you please state your name for the
10	record?
11	A William Vickers.
12	Q We're here in the matter of Cornelius
13	Whitfield. My court case number is 21-01513 CF. I
14	have a St. Petersburg Police Department case number of
15	2021-6023. Is that what you have?
16	A Yes, ma'am.
17	Q Great. My name is Julia Seifer-Smith. I'm
18	an assistant public defender, together with Ms.
19	Russell and Mr. McGreen, and we represent Mr.
20	Whitfield. Also present for the state are Theo Danzig
21	and Tom Koskinas.
22	Did you have an opportunity to review the
23	report that you wrote in connection with the case?
24	A I did.
25	Q Was there anything else that you reviewed in

connection with this case before being sworn in by our 1 court reporter? 2 3 Α No, ma'am. Was there anything else that you needed to 4 5 review before going further? 6 Α No, ma'am. Having reviewed that report, did that jog your memory as to your involvement? 8 9 Very minor. 10 Do you remember anything about your involvement in this case? 11 I managed traffic while everybody did their 12 13 thing at a location near Fremont, 31st. 14 It sounds like you had contact with somebody, like a member of the community at some point. 15 16 Based on what I reviewed in the report, yes. 17 Somebody claimed to be a stepfather I believe. 18 As you sit here today do you actually 19 remember having a conversation with this person? 20 Α Not one bit. 21 So you don't remember what this person looked 22 like or anything like that? 23 No, ma'am. Α 2.4 Based upon what you wrote in your report it Q 25 sounds like, for whatever reason, your contact with

this person was notable enough that a report was written.

Do you know why this person would have been important for you to make note of?

A It's pretty common practice that if you get information relating to a case of this nature, that you followup with all your actions and any observations. Somebody claiming to be, per my report, stepfather of a child, and knowing the mother of the child, would be reasonable information to pass along and to note.

- Q Okay. So this person approaches you. Are you holding a crime scene or are you just of like --
  - A Traffic.

- Q Traffic. Okay. And he identifies himself as Albert Andrews; is that right?
  - A According to my report, yes, ma'am.
- Q And that he was the stepfather of a child was who was located within a crime scene that was being investigated by St. Petersburg police?
- A To my knowledge. I had no direct involvement with the scene. I had no direct involvement with any of the investigation at all.
- Q But the traffic role that you were playing was in connection with that crime scene; is that

right? 1 2 Yes. Α 3 Q So it makes sense that somebody's gonna approach a police officer believing them to be 4 5 associated in some way with that particular crime 6 scene, right? 7 Yes, ma'am.
