3	(the deponent herein, being first duly sworn, was examined		
4	and testified as follows:)		
5	EXAMINATION		
6	BY MS. DELIBERATO:		
7	Q	Good afternoon. Could you please state and	
8	spell your last name for the record.		
9	А	Yes. Sean Paul Tipton. It's S-E-A-N, P-A-U-L,	
10	T-I-P-T-O-N.		
11	Q	And how are you employed?	
12	А	I work with Pinellas County Public Works.	
13	Q	And what do you do for them?	
14	А	I am well, currently I'm their debris	
15	manager.	I'm managing all of the debris cleanup. But my	
16	normal day-to-day would be right-of-way permitting		
17	coordinator.		
18	Q	Say that again, right-of-way what?	
19	А	Right-of-way permitting coordinator.	
20	Q	Okay. How long have you been employed with the	
21	county?		
22	А	Nineteen, almost twenty years.	
23	Q	Okay. My name is Maria DeLiberato. I'm an	
24	assistant	public defender. Myself and Nichole Blaquiere	
25	represent	Juan Molina-Salles who is charged in this case.	

Nathan Vonderheide is here for the State. 1 2 we're here for your deposition. Did you review anything before your deposition today? 3 4 No. ma'am. Α 5 Do you have any --0 6 Just the subpoena. Α 7 Okay. You were listed as a witness by the 0 I think you had some pretty minimal involvement, 8 9 but do you remember the incident with the Deputy Hartwick 10 being killed in an accident on 275 back in 2022? 11 I do, ma'am. Α Okay. And how was it that you actually became 12 Q 13 involved in this case? 14 We have a vehicle storage building at our Public works complex, and the Sheriff's department reached out to 15 us to see if they could store the loader that struck 16 17 Deputy Hartwick while they were conducting their 18 investigation so it stayed indoors and out of the weather 19 elements. Okay. And was that like -- did they contact you 20 Q 21 to do that? Did they contact --22 They reached out directly to I believe my Α director, Kelly Levee, and then the request got forwarded 23 over to meet them in the yard and get the loader put away 24

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and secured.

Do you know when that was? 1 Q 2 Yeah. It was -- I've got my notes. I did write Α 3 some notes just on some dates. It was the day of the 4 21st, the day of the incident later in the afternoon. 5 Okay. So the accident happened --Q I'm sorry, the 22nd. I apologize. I'm looking 6 at today's date. I've got a log of everything that I'm 7 doing day-to-day right now. So, no, it was actually 8 9 October 22nd of 2022 that it arrived at our Public Works facility. 10 we're going to try again because I think the 11 Q accident happened September 22nd, and then it was probably 12 into the next day, the 23rd. 13 14 Α Okay. But I don't know when it got to you. It's 15 16 possible it got to you a month later. So what do you --17 It would have been -- I'm just reading No. 18 off of my notes, just what I'm recollection [sic]. It arrived the same day that the incident happened. For some 19 20 reason my mind thought it was that date. I apologize. 21 That's okay. And how -- when was it that you Q first knew that the front-loader was there? 22 23 I got the call. I went down. I knew that it was in route to our yard, which is located at 22211 US 24

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Highway 19. We went and stood outside the vehicle storage

building, waited until one deputy showed up in a cruiser. We showed him where we were going to put it. He said okay. Then shortly thereafter, a tractor-trailer lowboy, like an equipment trailer pulled into the yard with another deputy cruiser following it.

Q And then it was like unloaded into your facility?

A Correct. They unloaded it. The gentleman that was operating and driving a lowboy backed it into the facility. The detectives put those little security strips on the door, and then we put blue -- like blue and green colored tarps just to kind of cover it. And then we put cones and kind of these expandable poles around it so our staff would not go over there and mess with it thinking it was a county loader or anything, and an e-mail was sent out to all staff.

Q Does that building remain locked?

A It is — it's open to county employees through a scan. So they have to wave their employee badge and they can get access in there. A lot of the crews will keep their vehicles and equipment in there. It's about ten different bays, big roll-up doors that they back into nightly just to keep their vehicles out of the weather elements as well.

Q Okay. Did you have any other involvement in

helping to secure the front-loader or go back to it at any other time.

A The only involvement I did was help the deputies with stretching the tarp over it. I climbed up on a tire on one side, and another deputy was on the other side. We stretched it over and kind of Bungee Cord it down to keep it in place. I did periodically put my head into the VSB to make sure the tarps were still in place how we left it, but other than that, no other involvement.

Q The VSB, is that the vehicle storage bay?

A Yes, ma'am. That's the vehicle storage. I'm sorry.

Q That's okay. At some point I know the front-loader was kind of released back out of your custody. Do you -- were you present for that?

A No. That I was not present for. My understanding is Jared -- his last name Rouillard -- he is our head fleet mechanic. The deputies -- it was on a Friday when -- we work a lot of Monday through Thursday. Friday is a skeleton staff and they're out in the field already, but fleet is there. Jared opened the vehicle storage building for the deputies on February 10th, 2023.

Q Okay.

A And they -- it was right around noon. I had -- I have another gentleman that has access to our cameras

way back when. Knowing that this trial was going to come up and I was not part of release, which I wanted to be because I originally I guess kind of took chain of custody, for lack of words, but he went back and verified on our security cameras. At 12:11 is when the building was opened up, and then at 12:21, it was loaded and the lowboy took the loader back out of the yard.

Q Okay. Did you talk to anybody, talk to the Sheriff's office, give an interview or anything like that about any of your involvement?

A No, ma'am.

Q Have you followed this case at all in the news, about anything that my client was arrested for or charged with? Anything like that?

A Yes, briefly. It of course made the news. I do work hand-in-hand routinely with the Sheriff's department for other things, road closures for accidents, fatality accidents, right now with the debris for helping out with traffic control. So I do work with them on a weekly, biweekly basis. So I do have some mutual -- not friends but mutual colleagues that we will talk, and I would get some -- not particular updates. Just, hey, did they find the guy? It's like, Yeah, they found them. Stuff like that. Very minimal. Really what I would see in the news, Facebook posts, stuff like that. I did watch the

1 Sheriff's Facebook post update that he provided as well. 2 Have you continued to follow the case sort of as Q 3 it winds its way through the court system? 4 No, ma'am. I figured you guys were still 5 pulling all the data together to take it to trial. Ι didn't even know if it's in trial or not. 6 Okay. And did you -- you said you had some kind 7 0 8 of mutual colleagues, friendships, relationships with some 9 of the deputies. Did you actually ever know Deputy 10 Hartwick, Michael Hartwick? No, ma'am. No. My neighbor down the street, he 11 Α 12 was partnered with him over in Safety Harbor when he was assigned to that unit. So just us talking -- he's got a 13 14 young kid the same age as my son, so they play. Just knowing that I had that minimal involvement, we just 15 16 talked. Kind of mutual buddies if he wanted to vent and 17 kind of talked, just to be a shoulder for him to -- you 18 know, somebody for him to listen. 19 Sure. Who's your neighbor? 0 Sean Cappiello, Deputy Cappiello. 20 Α Okay. Have you talked to him recently about it? 21 Q 22 NO. Huh-uh. Α 23 MS. DELIBERATO: Okay. I don't have any further questions. I apologize for being a little late 24 25 today.
