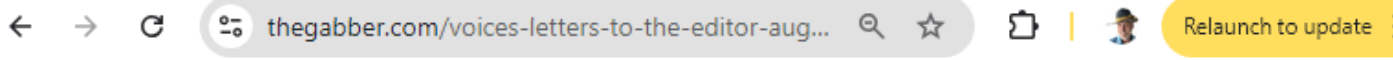

Florida's liveboard community certainly makes the state a better place, but as usual, guidelines must be implemented at a local level for emergency preparedness and safety. Seeing the preventable loss of life and devastation happen over and over simply signals the need for greater enforcement and education. And the responsibility on this local waterway — whether you want to pawn off responsibility or not — rests with the city and not the state or feds. The damage here occurs to the city, and instead of again wasting months waiting for the salvage and pier repair is unacceptable and negligent.

Proper and regular inspection of the anchorage is necessary, as well as civic enforcement for those registered vessels not taking cleanup duties responsibly. There is also no reason based on safety that so many vessels should be moored that close to the shoreline or so close to each other. Especially since moored boats rely on other small vessels to get ashore anyway.

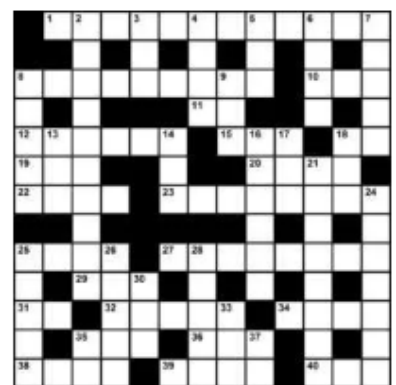
I've seen with my own eyes a patrol officer pestering people tying rowboats to the casino pier for little reason (you know who you are).
